Ronald McDonald House®

The Ronald McDonald House offers families a place to call home while their child is receiving critical medical treatment in area hospitals. For 32 years, our Ronald McDonald Houses have provided a "home-away-from-home" for 42,000 pediatric families in need of comfort and care during a most difficult time in their life. Annually, 2,000 families come through our doors, looking for a quiet place to rest their heads and find solace. There are three houses in St. Petersburg that care for families with children receiving treatment at All Children's Hospital: St. Pete East, St. Pete West and St. Pete Central. The Tampa House is located on the campus of Tampa General Hospital and also cares for families with children at St. Joseph's Children's Hospital of Tampa and Shriners Hospital.

Ronald McDonald Care Mobile®

The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile Program, managed by the University of South Florida Department of Pediatrics, is a mobile clinic that expands access to quality health care by providing medical and dental services to at-risk children in Hillsborough and Pasco counties. From February 2006 through December 2012 this program served 7,621 children and adolescents, providing approximately \$2 million of medical services through school visits and community health fairs at no charge to the patients' families. In addition, the Care Mobile makes weekly visits to community homeless and domestic violence shelters.

In 2012, the Care Mobile cared for 956 patients. In addition to providing health and dental care to children who have no medical care, the program also functions as an educational opportunity for USF pediatric residents, medical students and nurse practitioner students. Approximately 71 pediatric residents participate in the Care Mobile program as part of their Advocacy and Ambulatory rotations. They experience first-hand the challenges uninsured and underinsured children and their families face in receiving quality health care and finding dental and subspecialty providers to care for them. The Care Mobile helps prepare these future health care providers for the role of child health advocate within the community.

Scholarship program



The students, along with their families, school counselors and administrators from our 11 counties enjoyed a special lunch and were recognized for their hard work. McDonald's owner/operators and RMHC Board members also attended to honor the recipients and hear about their academic and community achievements.
