Ronald McDonald House Charities of Tampa Bay (RMHCTB) strives to make a difference in the lives of children and their families by finding, creating and supporting programs that directly enhance their health and well-being.


Our cornerstone Ronald McDonald House program began in 1980 based on a simple idea: Provide a "home-away-from-home" for families of seriously ill children receiving treatment at nearby hospitals. Since first opening our doors, more than 35,000 families have benefited from the comfort provided by our three Tampa Bay Ronald McDonald Houses. Our fourth house is scheduled to open inside the new All Children's Hospital Medical Annex in 2010 to provide immediate services to those parents who are unable to leave their child's bedside for more than a few moments at a time. This House will also provide services to all parents of children receiving treatment in the hospital.

Our newest program, the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile® has made a significant impact in our community since its inception in 2006, providing free medical and dental services to underserved children in Hillsborough and Pasco Counties. Most of these children are uninsured – making these visits with the Care Mobile critical for children whose only alternative to seeing a doctor may be going to a hospital emergency room.


Along with supporting our core program, RMHCTB awarded 46 college scholarships, totaling \$186,000 to deserving high school students in our eleven county area through the RMHC Scholarship program. We also provided healthcare grants to Tampa General and St. Joseph's Children's hospitals as well as the Salvation Army Sallie House, which provides housing to children who have been removed from their homes because of abuse or neglect. These grants help to make an immediate and positive impact on the lives of children in our community.

Together with support from hundreds of passionate and caring volunteers, donors and RMHCTB staff, we celebrate our mission carried out with love and dedication each day on behalf of the many children and families in need of our services.

Ronald McDonald House®

Since 1980 we have served more than 35,000 families in our three bay area houses offering 66 bedrooms each night to families with children being treated in nearby hospitals. St. Pete East and West are located adjacent to All Children's Hospital; Tampa's House is located next to Tampa General Hospital and also serves families with children at St. Joseph's Children's and Shriners Hospitals. A fourth house is under construction at the All Children's Hospital campus to serve families who cannot leave their child's bedside for more than a few minutes.

Ronald McDonald Care Mobile®

The RMCM Program, managed by the USF Department of Pediatrics, is a mobile clinic that expands access to quality health care in the Tampa Bay area by providing accessible medical and dental services to underserved and underinsured children. The RMCM travels to 69 of the 209 Hillsborough County School District elementary, middle, and high schools. From February 2006 through November 2008 the program served 4,278 students, providing over \$923,000 of medical services through school visits and community health fairs at no charge to the patient's families. In addition, a community homeless center and a domestic violence shelter are scheduled for monthly RMCM visits.

RMHCTB Scholarship Program

Forty-six high school students selected as this year's scholarship recipients from our elevencounty area were honored at a luncheon in early December. Most of these recipients will be the first in their family to attend college. Families, friends and McDonald's owner/operators heard Ernest Hooper, a writer for the St. Petersburg Times and father of teens speak about his own background and the challenges he overcame on his way to his career as a successful writer.
